# HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION FEES RAISED FOR 2026

Each Fall, the HOA Board meets to review budgets. This includes deciding if we need to raise our annual HOA dues too. We discuss financial trends, possible enhancement projects in the neighborhood, must have repairs to our community spaces etc. The past four years have been hard because we have seen astronomical raises in cost of living. This isn't just with grocery bills but also includes the utility bills for the community center and pool and our vendors who keep the neighborhood beautiful and safe. It's not a decision we take lightly because the annual raise in the dues affects us too. We have retirees and single salary homeowners on the board and everyone has had to tighten belts to make ends meet. But we do need to look at the bigger picture and how we want our community to develop and thrive with all of the newer communities surrounding us. On the bright side, even though we have had to raise the figure each year for several years now, we are still the lowest HOA in the northside and we have one of the most coveted neighborhood pool and community facility areas. We do not strive to ever reach their HOA fees either and hope to remain the lowest for years to come. We also understand that the reasoning behind raising the dues may not seem like it affects all homeowners. My mother doesn't use any of the facilities anymore – and she has been here in Encino Park since 1986. But she knows that the dues help the neighborhood to be fairly safe for her to walk every morning and the integrity of the homes and neighbors are constantly above bar.

We also will never hide any financial decision from the neighborhood. Monthly, Spectrum posts all of our financial statements on the neighborhood website. A. <u>action plan</u>: Create a fire escape plan, and practice with all the members of your home. Also, make sure every room has two ways to escape, and create a family emergency communications plan.

N. <u>neighbors</u>: Reach out. Identify neighbors you feel may be vulnerable to fire dangers, then safely and kindly do your best to connect. Also, remember to help check your vulnerable family members living spaces frequently.






# OUT TO LUNCH
